

Tamara in Moldova and the Swartz Family in Princeton USA

At this time of year, we often send a gift to Tamara Bucur in Moldova. Since 1996 she has started a church in her village that has a special focus on preaching the Gospel and sharing it in action through helping the elderly and children. She has facilitated building a church centre and also cares for 9 children who are orphaned. WORLD FOCUS

AFGHANISTAN

Even in the darkest corners of the earth, there is cause for praising our Saviour and prayer that His light will shine ever brighter. The Gospel is continuing to spread in Afghanistan, despite fierce persecution. In 2025 “more than 50 people were baptised in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.....Remarkably, every one of them is under 30 years old.....This rising generation is desperate for truth, for hope, for a God who is living and real.”, said a church leader working in great secrecy.

Followers of Jesus are at constant risk in Afghanistan, both from the Taliban authorities and from extremists within the Muslim-majority population. Sharia (Islamic law) is strictly enforced by the Taliban who, on their return to power in 2021, warned Christians that they had three choices: leave, reconvert to Islam or face death. Despite the risks, small groups of believers are gathering regularly for prayer, worship and Bible study.

Pray:- Give thanks to the Lord that the Church is growing even amid the secrecy imposed by the harsh government in Afghanistan. Pray that believers will continue to grow in their faith and draw others to the truth.

NIGERIA

Previously I reported that in November, 303 pupils and 12 teachers were abducted from a Christian boarding school in Niger State. Fifty of the pupils escaped. In early December, 100 were released. On Dec 22nd, it was announced that the remaining hostages had been released.

Pray:- Give thanks for this turn of events and pray for the victims of this abduction, that the Lord will heal and restore.
